




Vacation Bible School is back this year we will be meeting in July 27, 28, 29 at 6:00 pm to 7:30 pm.



# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Church Family,


I hope and pray that you all are doing well by the Grace of Our Lord Jesus Christ. We are moving forward in our series on the book of Hebrews. This week we engaged in a text from the book of Hebrews which encourages us to have a new hunger for our spiritual growth. Hebrews 6:9-12, "Even though we speak like this, dear friends, we are convinced of better things in your case—the things that have to do with salvation. God is not unjust; he will not forget your work and the love you have shown him as you have helped his people and continue to help them. We want each of you to show this same diligence to the very end, so that what you hope for may be fully realized. We do not want you to become lazy, but to imitate those who through faith and patience inherit what has been promised.'

These words from the book of Hebrews are in a way encouragement as well as challenging to us because it makes us realize that like the first century Jewish Christians, we too lack in our spiritual growth. However, there is hope for us just like there was for the first century Christians. In the case of the first century Christian, life was tough and they faced persecution and even death threat due to following Christianity. It was easy for them to revert back to the old ways of Judaism which had to do with Law and following the Jewish religion and to give up on the Christianity. Within our context we too can find times within our spiritual lives when we are backslidden in to the old ways of life that we used to do before we were a Christian. It is easy for us to be tempted to the old ways of sinful life. Just like it was for the first century Christians and that's where the author of Hebrews gives a message of encouragement and hope with a challenge.

The Author of Hebrews says,"We don't want you to become lazy or in other words stop slacking in your walk with God." Rather the author encourages us to imitate those who through faith and patience inherit what had been promised. At the end of chapter 6 the author encourages us to keep our hope on the anchor. If we want to develop faith we need to look to the author and perfector of Our Faith that is Jesus. If we want to make it until the end we need to be connected to the anchor. If we're connected to the anchor we can face storms of life and with the anchor with us we can find stability. We can face life's challenges if we're connected to Jesus.

Are you connected to the anchor? How are you spending time with the anchor? Within the book of Hebrews we can find many heroes of the Faith mentioned. We can start our journey by simply picking up the bible and start reading the stories of the Heroes of Faith to encourage us to be anchored to
